EATON SQUARE TENNIS COURT RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Only approved tennis shoes or plimsolls should be worn. Training shoes with serrated soles **MUST NOT** be used under any circumstances.
2. Appropriate clothing (which should include shirt or t-shirt) should be worn at all times.
3. At least one paid-up player must be on court at all playing times.
4. The use of the court is permitted between the hours of 8.00 am and 9.00 pm only.
5. Playing time is limited to one hour if the court is required by another player.
6. The court may be booked one day in advance by paid-up players. Booking forms will be left in the desk situated within the court so that players may enter the appropriate details against the time and date they wish to play. Only one advance booking may be made for any one day and a player may not book for guests alone.
7. If a player has booked the court and has not arrived within a quarter of an hour of the start of his booking, another player may use the court. However, he/she must give way to the player who originally booked should he/she arrive at any time during the period in question.
8. The court must be locked at all times when not in use by the player last using the court.
9. The key entrusted to the player is the property of Grosvenor and must not under any circumstances pass from the possession of the player. The key should be returned to Helen Ensom, The Grosvenor Office, 46 Eaton Mews North, London SW1X 8LL when the member leaves the Eaton Square address.
10. The court must not be used if there is any danger that damage may occur as a result of recent rain, frost etc.
11. The use of the court is at the discretion of Grosvenor and any right to use the court may, at the sole discretion of Grosvenor, be revoked for any reason whatsoever. Grosvenor reserves the right to amend the rules should it be deemed necessary.
12. At the discretion of Grosvenor and primarily in order to minimise possible damage to the court, Grosvenor reserve the right at any time to close the court for any reasons without notice, although it will endeavour to give adequate notice where possible.
